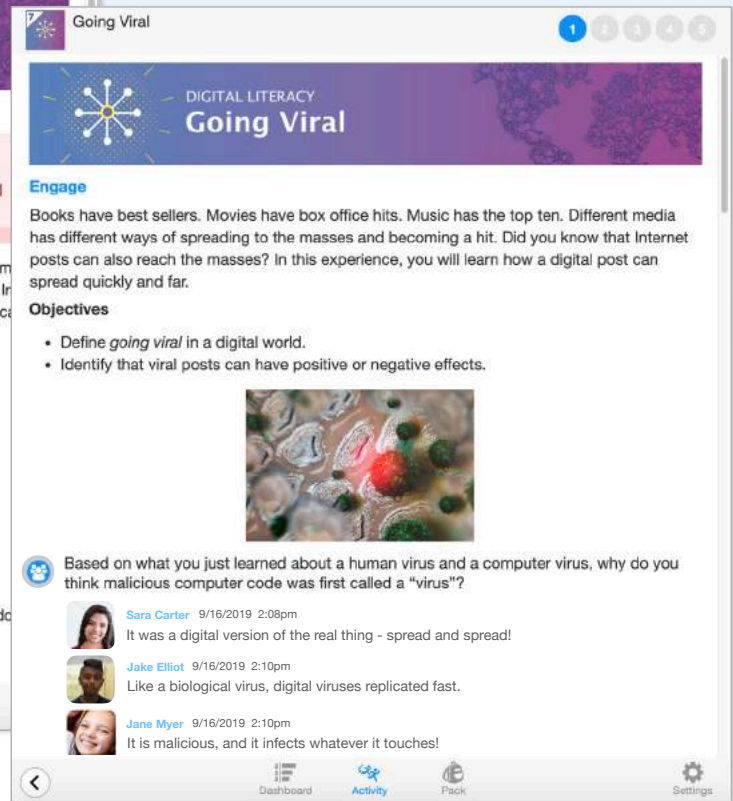


# Empower Students. Enrich Dialogue.
