Employers may conduct background checks to ensure that they are hiring individuals who are not a risk to the safety and security of the organization or its employees.




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To make informed decisions

To verify the accuracy of an individual's resume

Employers may conduct background checks to verify that an individual's resume is accurate and that they have the qualifications and experience they claim to have.

To comply with legal requirements

Some organizations, such as those in certain industries or those that work with vulnerable populations, may be required by law to conduct background checks on employees or volunteers.
